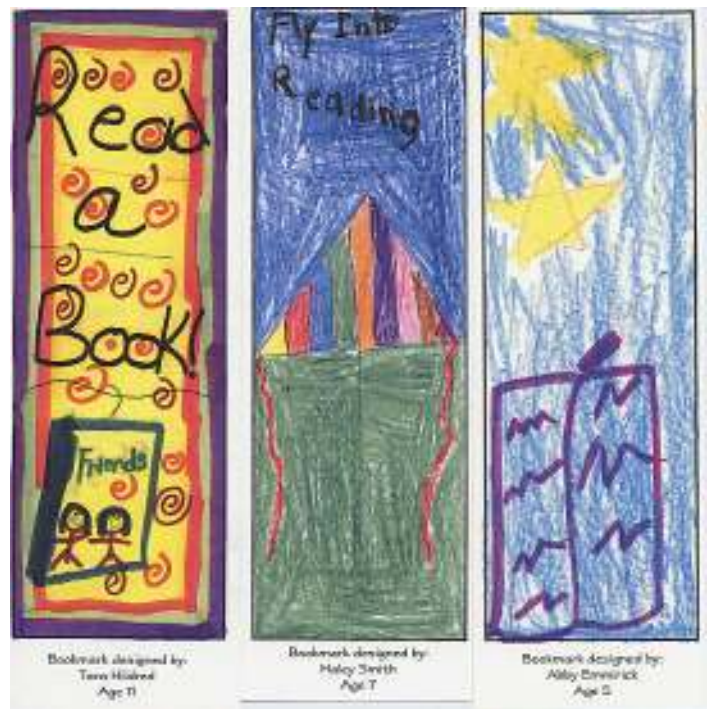

This year we are encouraging families to "Get a Clue" at the library with a mystery theme. Summer Reading will begin June 11th and conclude on July 28th. Just type in your library card number, and you have complete access to repair, maintenance, and recall information for most vehicles from 1954 to today's latest models. NoveList is a database available to library patrons through the Lebanon Public Library's homepage. Log into the database using your library card to browse hundreds of categories and genres. 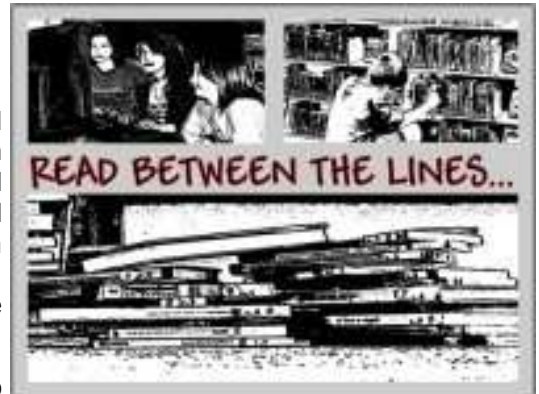
